The Northern Lights (aurora borealis)	The bright dancing lights are collisions between electrically charged particles from the sun that enter the Earth's atmosphere. They are not visible all the time, but they are often sighted within the Arctic Circle.	
Ice field	A series of inter-connected glaciers and ice caps.	
Geyser	A rare kind of hot spring that erupts sending jets of water into the air.	
Fjord	A fjord is a deep, narrow and elongated sea or lake drain, with steep land on three sides.
