National Focus on Attendance

As announced this week by the Government there is an increased focus on children's attendance at school especially after such a difficult couple of years. High attendance has always been the key factor in children achieving higher educational results, even in non-COVID times. Now there is even more emphasis on children returning to school full time to make sure everyone can meet their full potential.

Our whole school year to date attendance figure is 93.71%, which is slightly below the national average.

Spotlight on Punctuality

Poor punctuality can lead to your child:

- Feeling embarrassed in front of their friends
- Missing the beginning of vital lessons making them fall behind
- Missing important instructions for the rest of the school day
- Learning bad habits which could affect their employability in the future

Late marks after the register closes at 9.20am are recorded as an unauthorised session and can lead to possible legal sanctions.

Reporting Absence

If your child is too ill to attend school, please contact the School Office before 8.30am with full details of your child's illness/symptoms. If we do not hear from you, we will call you to find out why your child is not in school. If we are unable to make contact and you do not provide a reason for your child's absence, this absence will be recorded as unauthorised. If a pupil has two consecutive days of unauthorised absence with no reason given then this becomes a safeguarding concern. Please make sure you update the Office every day of your child's absence unless advised otherwise.
