

Key biome characteristics			
Tundra	Treeless areas around the North and South Poles, with little precipitation and frozen ground.		
Taiga forest	Forests with evergreen trees found in temperate regions.		
Temperate forest	Forests in wet and mild areas, dominated by trees that lose their leaves in autumn (deciduous).		
Temperate grassland	Flat and open areas with mostly grass and few trees.		
Savanna(h)	Hot and dry areas with two distinct seasons (wet and dry) with mostly grass and few trees.		
Tropical rainforest	Forests found near the Equator, which are hot and humid and have a huge variety of plants and animals.		
Desert	Driest areas on Earth. Deserts can be hot or cold. All have little precipitation, vegetation or animals.
