
Tier 3 Vocabulary

Flacking	Ememem uses this word to describe his work. It means puddle
Tessera	An individual tile used for making a mosaic
Complementary colours	Colours that are on opposite sides of a colour wheel When you place complementary colours next to each other, they create high contrast and appear brighter
Mosaic	A mosaic is a picture made up of small parts
Primary colours	The three primary colours are red, yellow and blue
Secondary colours	A colour resulting from the mixing of two primary colours – purple, orange, green
Geometric pattern	A geometric pattern comprises a series of shapes or lines A pattern is created out of shapes that are repeated

Ememem is an **anonymous** French street artist based in Lyon, France. They create mosaics incorporating geometric motifs in cracked pavements and walls. A process they call *flacking*. Ememem creates art at night, so that it will be discovered at dawn.




