A message from Mr Kilsby

In-line with other Headteachers that I talk to, we are increasingly seeing the impact of the surge in the cost of living; both in terms of the significant pressure on the school's budget and in the challenges that our families are now having to face.

You may be aware that all schools receive Pupil Premium Funding (PPF) to support those families who are eligible for free-school meals. In 2017, 9% of the school population were in receipt of PPF. This figure now stands at 19% (92 children), and it is reflected in the increased level of need that we are now witnessing across our community.

In order to realise our curriculum aim of ensuring that <u>all</u> children are phenomenally well-equipped for the next stage of their academic lives and beyond, we recognise the need to work in partnership with both our families and the wider community. Indeed, without the donations we receive from a number of local businesses (including Malary Environmental; Voland Roofing; Andrew Turner Builders and Redrow), as well as local charities and our own, peerless PTCA, we would we not be able to run many of the programmes that support our most vulnerable children and their families. For this, I am sincerely grateful.

However, as winter starts to show its teeth, the reality is that there are other families who are now struggling. If this is the case, then please come and have a confidential conversation with us. Whilst there is obviously a limit to what we can do, it might just make the difference—and you are not alone. We are currently issuing monthly bags of 'essentials' to a number of households, as well as providing a daily breakfast for around 20 children. We are also able to issue Food Bank Vouchers for those families who are in severe need. Do not forget that we also have second-hand uniform available, should you need it.

In addition to what we can offer directly as a school, we can also signpost you to a number of other groups and agencies who may be able to offer support.
