

## Reception Curriculum Summer 1<sup>st</sup> Half 2024

Personal Social & Emotional Development	Physical Development	Communication and Language
This half term, the children will be learning how to recognise their own feelings and who might support them. They will also consider how to take care of their environment Linking to the Growing and Changing topic, the children will also be thinking about how to take care of plants and animals.	Within class we will continue to focus on ensuring that children are developing their fine motor skills for effective handwriting. The children will continue to develop their ability to write on a line and we will focus on controlling letter size. Within P.E lessons we will be covering multiskills and team games. We will be developing our ball skills and use of P.E equipment such as bats.	This term our focus will be on children understanding and using both new topic vocabulary and RVI words (see below). We will also be encouraging children to listen carefully to their peers and begin to teach them how to build on what another person has said.
Literacy	Mathematics	Understanding the World
Children will continue to develop their writing. They will be applying their knowledge of phonics to their writing. They will be encouraged to write in sentences, beginning to use capital letters and full stops. We will be teaching children the capital letters. In reading children will be applying their phonic knowledge to more complex words and extending their sight vocabulary so that they can read with greater fluency. Children will be working on phonics in their Read, Write Inc groups.	This half term we will be looking at doubling, halving and sharing. Children will also work on consolidating their knowledge of number bonds to ten and counting to 20 and beyond.	Children will be learning about the lifecycles of animals such as butterflies and frogs. They will be able to identify farm animals and their young. Children will also be learning how to identify different animal habitats. The children will learn how to identify different types of mini beast. We will also plant a variety of seeds and we will be learning about what a seed needs in order to grow.
