July 11, 1907 – January 29, 2001

A famous American War Artist and muralist.

Won multiple awards and honours of recognition for his realistic and impactful depictions of WW2 in the South Pacific.

Paul Nash

(11 May 1889 – 11 July 1946)

Paul Nash was a British surrealist painter and war artist.

During both the First and Second World Wars Paul Nash was paid by the government to paint or draw events that were happening in the war.

Paul Nash's paintings didn't just document the war in a straightforward way. In this painting, the huge red watery sunset adds a powerful feeling of sadness to this scene of a crashed plane.
