'Top Tips'

- All absences (including pre-booked medical appointments) need to be notified to us by completing a
 "Request for Exceptional Leave of Absence" form. This can be found on our website under the
 Parents/Attendance tab.
- If your child is not well, please make sure you report the absence <u>every morning</u> your child is not in school (unless advised otherwise). You can do this by calling the school on our absence line or by e-mailing <u>office@cottenham.cambs.sch.uk</u> Please provide details of the nature of the absence as best as you can and when your child is likely to be returning to school.
- We strongly request that, unless they are hospital or emergency appointments, all GP, dentist and optician appointments are always booked for outside of school hours. In the event of your child having to miss school because of the appointment, we kindly ask that you provide us with evidence of the appointment, via an email confirmation, scan of the appointment card or the actual appointment letter, all of which can be brought to the School Office or e-mailed to the Office e-mail account (see above).
- Any time a child is not present when the class registers are taken, it is coded as an absence, whether it is due to an authorised or an unauthorised absence. There is a clear link between absence and attainment the higher the percentage of sessions missed, the lower the level of attainment at the end of the Key Stage. Please work with us to maximise your child's attendance.
