What is Landscape Drawing?

Landscape drawing is an art form that shows an outdoor scene, often from nature, such as the countryside or the sea.

Key Facts about Landscape Drawing

Landscape drawings can include people or animals but the focus is on the scenery.

Landscape drawings can include city scenes or seascapes.

The term landscape drawing comes from the Dutch word *landschap*.

Many landscape drawings are divided into foreground, middle ground and background.

Key Facts about Angela Edwards

Angela Edwards:

- is a contemporary British painter.
- paints in colour with oil paints on canvas and draws in black and white with charcoal on cartridge paper.
- has her own studio (Town Quay) in Sussex to display her drawings and paintings.
- creates abstract and realistic pieces of work.

Tier 3 Vocabulary

Perspective drawing	A technique used in art to create the illusion of 3-D space, depth, and distance on a flat (2-D) surface, such as paper.
Charcoal	Burnt wood that is used to create black and white drawings.
Tone	How light or dark a colour or shade appears.
Shading	Marks used to darken parts of a drawing or painting to show different degrees of light or shades of colour.
Blending	Mixing colours, tones, or pencil marks together so that they gradually merge into one another.
Smoothing lines	Creating continuous and even strokes without abrupt changes in direction.
