Angela Edwards Landscape Drawing

What is Landscape Drawing?

Landscape drawing is an art form that captures the beauty and diversity of the natural world often showing countrysides or seashores.

Key Facts about Landscape Drawing

- Landscape drawings can include people or animals but the focus is in the scenery
- Can include buildings or city scenes known as cityscapes
- Landscape drawing and painting developed in 17th Century
- The term landscape drawing comes from the Dutch word landschap
- Many landscape drawings are divided into foreground, middleground and background

Tier 3 Vocabulary

Perspective Drawing	A way of showing objects so they seem the correct size and distance in relation to each other.
Charcoal	Burnt wood that is used to create black and white drawings.
Tone	The relative lightness or darkness of an area
Shading	The darkening or colouring of a diagram
Blending	Smoothing lines and tones together
Smoothing lines	Creating continuous and even strokes without abrupt changes in direction.

Key facts about Angela Edwards and her work

She is a current British artist

She is a contemporary painter who graduated in 2014 with a first-class (Hons) degree in fine art painting

She works in colour with oil paints on canvas and in black and white with charcoal on cartridge paper

She has her own studio (Town Quay) in Sussex to display her drawings and paintings. Some sell for thousands of pounds.

Since 2020 she has been shortlisted for at least six awards and prizes

She creates abstract and realistic pieces of work
