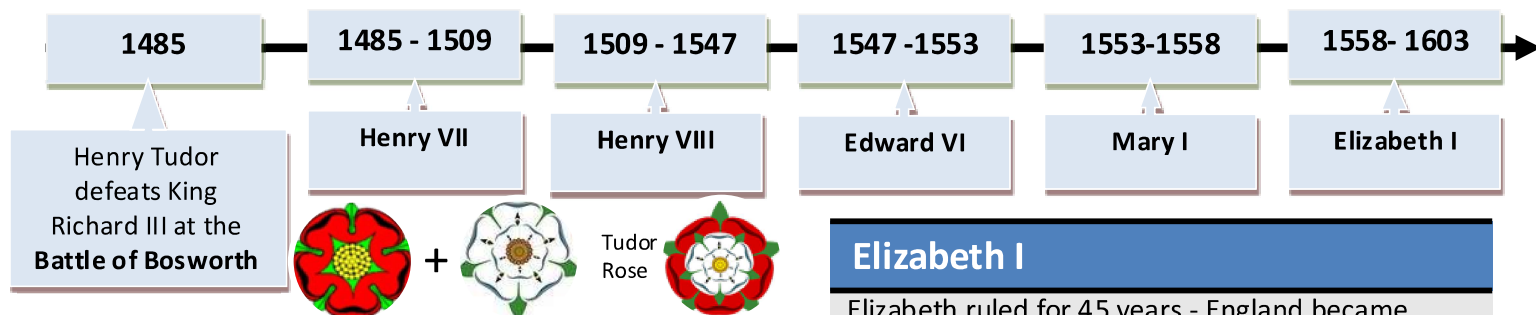


Knowledge Organiser Year 4 History: The Tudors

Who were the Tudors and why were they important?



Tier 3 Vocabulary

Catholic	A branch of Christianity ruled over by the Pope in Rome
Dynasty	A line of rulers from the same family who rule a country or kingdom for a long time
English Reformation	Henry VIII created a new church called the Church of England, breaking away from the Catholic Church
Golden Age	A significant cultural, artistic, and political achievements, exploration, and relative stability
Protestant	A branch of Christianity that became separate from the Catholic church in the 16th century
Symbolism	The use of symbols or pictures represent a deeper meaning
War of the Roses	Civil wars in England between the rival houses of Lancaster and York

Elizabeth I

Elizabeth ruled for 45 years - England became richer and more powerful.

The Elizabethan Age was an age of discovery, new lands were explored and discovered.

Mary Queen of Scots was caught plotting to murder Elizabeth.

1588: Phillip of Spain sent a huge **armada** of warships to invade England. It was defeated.

Elizabeth re-established the Church of England during her reign

Elizabeth never married or had children.

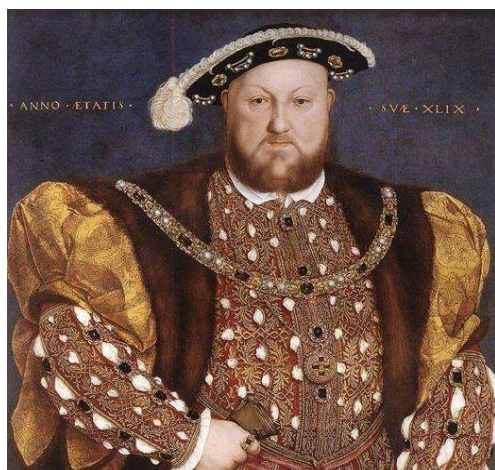


1st Catherine of Aragon

Henry VIII

Henry wanted to divorce his first wife, Catherine of Aragon because she did not give birth to a male heir.

The Catholic Church did not allow divorce, so Henry decided to '**Break with Rome**' and set himself up as the Head of the Church in England.

As a result, England became a Protestant country.
