Fold mountain	Where two or more of the Earth's tectonic plates are pushed together.
Fault-block mountain	Faults or cracks in the earth's crust force some materials or blocks of rock up and others down.
Dome mountain	Rising magma pushes rock layers up to form a dome shape.
