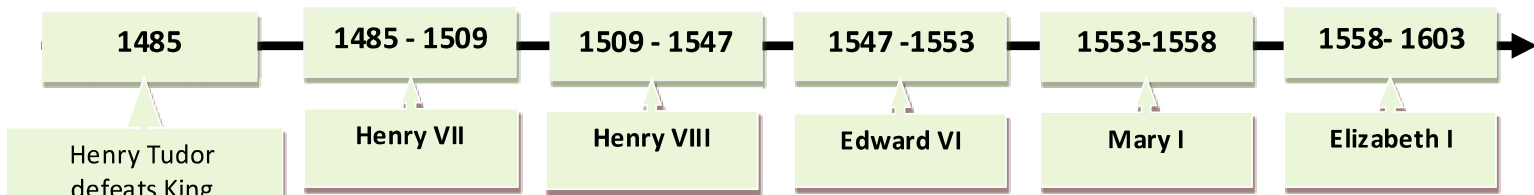
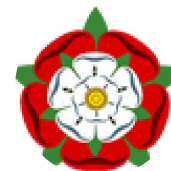

How did the Tudors gain and keep power?

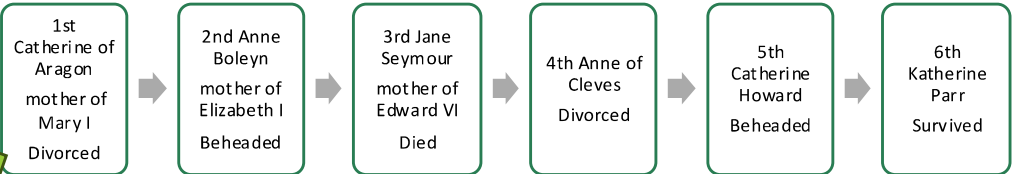


Henry VIII

Henry wanted to divorce his first wife, Catherine of Aragon because she did not give birth to a male heir.

The Catholic Church did not allow divorce, so Henry decided to **'Break with Rome'** and set himself up as the Head of the Church in England.

As a result, England became a protestant country.

Elizabeth I

During her reign, England became richer and more powerful. Elizabeth paid for many voyages to explore newly 'discovered' countries.

1586: **Mary Queen of Scots** was caught plotting to murder Elizabeth.

1588: Phillip of Spain sent a huge **armada** of warships to invade England. It was defeated.

Mary I had made England a Catholic country again. Elizabeth re-established the Church of England during her reign

Elizabeth never married or had children.
